# Butler County Health Department Services

## Records

### Birth Certificates

Recordings of birth beginning January 1, 1930. For a birth certificate to be issued at the health department, all applicants must complete the birth section of the "Application for a Vital Record" form and provide a valid picture ID. The fee will be \$15. If paying with a card, there will be an additional \$2 charge. Certificates are available within 15 minutes after the form has been turned in to the vital records department. Please note that **not** all birth certificates are available for printing due to various reasons (born out of state, etc.).

### Death Certificates

Recordings of death beginning January 1, 1980. To receive a death certificate, the applicant will fill out the same form as above, except fill out the death instead of the birth sections. The fee is \$14 for the first and \$11 for each additional certificate in the same request. As above, if using a card for payment, there is an additional \$2 charge. Certificates will be available within 15 minutes after form submission.

\*\*\* Vital records are open Monday through Friday, 8 am - 4:15 pm. \*\*\*

## Immunizations

### Flu Vaccination

The Butler County Health Department offers flu vaccines to members of the community. Flu vaccines are available on a walk-in basis, Monday - Friday, 8 am until 4 pm.

### COVID-19 Vaccinations

The health department also offers COVID vaccinations every Monday, and it is by appointment only. Please call 573-785-8478 to schedule an appointment.

# Family Planning

## Women's Wellness Exams

The Butler County Health Department offers women's wellness exams that include a pap smear, pelvic exam, and breast exam. These exams allow for early detection of any health problems. Another part of women's wellness is pregnancy testing. The health department offers pregnancy testing to those who suspect they may be pregnant.

## STI Screenings and Treatment

The Butler County Health Department conducts screening and provides treatment for Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, and Syphilis. HIV and Hepatitis C testing is available as well. All testing is confidential and free of charge.

## Birth Control

The Butler County Health Department offers multiple forms of birth control by appointment. The birth control methods offered are:

- IUD
- Implant
- The shot
- The ring
- The patch
- The pill
- Internal and External condoms
- Emergency Contraception

## Women's Health

### Show Me Healthy Women

Show Me Healthy Women (SMHW) began in 1992 and is Missouri's implementation of the National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program. It provides free breast and cervical cancer screenings throughout Missouri for women who meet certain age, income, and insurance guidelines. SMHW is funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and several national, regional, and local partner organizations. As part of the SMHW program, Butler County Health Department offers clinical breast exams, screening mammograms for women 50-64 (target population)

### WISE WOMAN

The Butler County Health Department conducts screening and provides treatment for Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, and Syphilis. HIV and Hepatitis C testing is available as well. All testing is confidential and free of charge. Health assessments are completed to identify any lifestyle habits that increase the risk of heart disease and stroke, including low intake of fruits and vegetables, smoking, and low physical activity. Risk counseling helps to interpret the health assessment results and explain to the woman her risk for heart disease and stroke. WISE WOMAN provides education to help each woman make the changes when she is ready. Please call us for more information.

### Prenatal Case Management

Prenatal Case management helps pregnant females with temporary Medicaid, provides information and referrals, along with health education. The health education resources provided by this program are gestational diabetes, prenatal care, nutrition, delivery, preterm labor, breastfeeding, and the harmful effects of alcohol, drugs, and tobacco on mother and infant.

## W.I.C.

### Nutrition

WIC participants are required to receive nutrition education minimum of one time between every certification and mid-certification. Nutrition education is available one-on-one with a on-site nutritionist or an online option is available for participants who are not high-risk. Participants also receive benefits to purchase specific foods at the grocery store each month which are designed to supplement their diets. WIC foods are high in one or more of the following nutrients: protein, calcium, vitamins A, B6, C, D, folate, iron, and zinc.

### Breast Feeding Support

Our health department encourages families to breastfeed and offers breastfeeding services including prenatal breastfeeding classes, breastfeeding peer counselor program, certified lactation consultant, manual and electric breast pumps, after hours breastfeeding support line, and a monthly mom-to-mom breastfeeding support group hosted at the Butler County Health Department.

### Milk Bank

A Milk Depot is a conveniently located collection site for approved human milk donors. The Butler County Health Department is an approved collection site. Area donors that have been approved by The Milk Bank can drop off their excess breastmilk at the Depot. These donations are collected and sent to The Milk Bank where they will be bottled, pasteurized, and tested for sterility by an independent lab before being dispensed to an ordering hospital or an outpatient with a physician's prescription. ## Prevention Services

### HIV Case Management

The HIV Care Coordination Program is a comprehensive, client-centered approach to service delivery designed to ensure individuals living with HIV who have complex needs receive timely, coordinated, and effective care. Care Coordination emphasizes active participation from clients or their designated representatives in every aspect of the case management process. Through a personalized and collaborative approach, case management connects clients to medical care, psychosocial support, and other essential services.

The HIV Case Management Program serves Missouri residents living with HIV whose income is at or below 300% of the federal poverty level. Services are comprehensive and tailored to individual needs, and may include: housing assistance, health insurance enrollment and support, copay assistance, dental care, referrals to medical and supportive services.

Through the Butler County Health Department, this program proudly serves individuals in nine counties across Southeast Missouri: Butler, Carter, Dunklin, New Madrid, Pemiscot, Reynolds, Ripley, Stoddard, and Wayne.

By delivering compassionate, coordinated, and client-focused services, the program empowers individuals living with HIV to achieve improved health outcomes, greater stability, and an enhanced quality of life.

### PrEP

PrEP (pre-exposure prophylaxis) is a medication that, when taken as prescribed, can reduce the likelihood of someone getting HIV by up to 99 percent. To use PrEP, a person must test negative for HIV. PrEP protects against HIV, but not all other STIs, so one should practice safe sex while taking PrEP. PrEP could be a good option for you if you have had more than one sex partner in the last 12 months, have a partner living with HIV, have ever had an STI, or if you or your sex partner injects drugs.

The Butler County Health Department offers a monthly clinic for PrEP medication. The PrEP clinic is no-cost, by appointment only, and there is a patient assistance program available to help with medication costs if uninsured. These services are available in partnership with the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services.

## Prevention Services

### STI/HIV Prevention

The STI/HIV Prevention Program helps individuals understand their risk for sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and HIV while providing tools and support to reduce the risk of infection or transmission. This program also supports the national Ending the HIV Epidemic (EHE) initiative led by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, which aims to end the HIV epidemic in the United States by 2030.

Services are available across 20 counties in Southeast Missouri and focus on reaching populations most at risk. The program offers: educational classes, evidence-based interventions, free safer sex supplies, rapid testing for HIV, syphilis, and Hepatitis C, risk-reduction counseling and linkage to care and treatment for individuals who test positive.

Free safer sex supplies are available in person at the Butler County Health Department or through discreet mail delivery at [www.condoms.fyi](http://www.condoms.fyi).

Through prevention, testing, and access to care, the STI/HIV Prevention Program is committed to improving community health and helping end the HIV epidemic.

## Communicable Diseases

### Tuberculosis

The Health Department provides tuberculosis (TB) skin testing and follow-up. Free anti-TB medications can be obtained at the health department through the Missouri Department of Health with a doctor's order.

### Communicable Disease Surveillance and Reporting

Missouri has 116 reportable communicable diseases, such as tuberculosis, whooping cough, hepatitis, measles, and meningitis. Local health care providers are required to report such diseases to the Health Department. A Public Health Nurse and Environmental Public Health Specialists investigate and follow up on reported communicable diseases to identify the origin of the disease, control further spread, and prevent recurrence.

Diseases like Hepatitis, Measles, Salmonella, Tuberculosis, Brucellosis, Rabies, Meningitis, and many more are reported to the Health Department. The health department will provide follow-up contacts for the patients and provide some services for the patients themselves.

## Other Services

### Health Education

The Butler County Health Department is staffed by full-time Health Educators who serve as trusted resources for health education, information, and community outreach.

Health Educators are available to provide presentations and educational programs at civic, community, and school-related events. The Health Education Department offers age-appropriate curriculum on a wide range of topics, including nutrition, physical activity, childcare health consultation, abstinence-based education, chronic disease prevention, heart disease and stroke prevention, tobacco use prevention and cessation, clean indoor air initiatives, and other topics upon request.

In addition, the department offers specialized programs focused on overdose prevention, community gardening, childcare consultation services, maternal and child health, Safe Crib for Missouri, Car Seat Fittings, Social Determinants of Health, and Building Communities for Better Health (BCBH). Through education, outreach, and strong community partnerships, the Health Education Department remains committed to empowering individuals and strengthening the overall health and well-being of Butler County residents.

### Community Garden

The Health Department has a community garden located behind the building. The garden is available to the members of the community who wish to assist in the care and upkeep. The garden will provide access to fresh vegetables. If you would like fresh vegetables, come to the BCHD lobby and check out the selection in our mini fridge. There are other gardens located in Hendrickson Park and on Grove Street.

### Tower Garden

The health department has two tower gardens located on our lower level. Tower gardens automatically deliver the nutrients and water needed to grow healthy plants. These gardens allow the health department to provide the community with greens and herbs year-round. To benefit from either garden, head up to the health department and go to the mini fridge in the lobby, and you will find fresh produce available.

## Other Services Cont.

### Children and Youth With Special Health Care Needs

The Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs Program (CYSHCN) provides assistance statewide for individuals from birth to age 21 who have or are at increased risk for a medical condition that may hinder their normal physical growth and development and who require more medical services than children and youth generally. The program focuses on early identification and service coordination for individuals who meet medical eligibility guidelines. As payer of last resort, the CYSHCN Program has limited funding for medically necessary diagnostic and treatment services for individuals whose families also meet financial eligibility guidelines.

### Environmental Public Health Specialist (EPHS)

The Butler County Health Department conducts inspections of all food establishments throughout the county to ensure compliance with health and safety regulations. This includes school cafeterias, restaurants, mobile food vendors, taverns, retail grocery stores, and other facilities where food is prepared, served, or sold.

Private water testing kits are available for purchase at the department's reception desk. Each kit costs \$10 and includes the materials needed to collect and submit a water sample for testing.
